### **NCCT**

 P5A – Every other Thursday 8.50-2.50, Mrs Gall will be leading in class to allow Mr Burton to plan for learning.

 P5B – Every Tuesday 8.50-9.30, Mrs Gall will lead in class. Every Thursday 8.50-11.00, Mr McGachie (PE specialist from Lasswade High School) will lead in class to allow Miss Melrose to plan for learning.



### Literacy

- Both classes are currently enjoying reading "Why the Whales Came" by Michael Morpurgo. We will read a broad range of class novels throughout the year.
- Children have the opportunity to read for enjoyment daily using the Accelerated Reading (AR) programme. We learn reading skills in whole class guided reading sessions at least once a week.
- Grammar is taught weekly on a Monday and is a focus in all writing throughout the week. Children have the opportunity to develop cursive handwriting weekly in line with school presentation expectations.
- Extended pieces of writing are developed using the Talk for Writing framework. Over three weeks, children will imitate a model text, innovate a shared version and then invent an independent piece. So far, we have written excellent news reports using this process.
- Spelling rules and patterns are taught weekly and applied in a variety of practise activities. Dictation on a Friday allows children to self-assess their progress and next steps.
- Across of the curriculum, we use Talking Partners and class discussions to help us develop our listening and talking skills. There are regular opportunities to present to the whole class and give and receive feedback.



### **Numeracy and Maths**

- Numeracy and Maths is taught everyday to ensure children learn new concepts and consolidate learning.
- We will continue to follow the Midlothian progression covering all aspects of maths and numeracy.
- Children are encouraged to talk about their strategies and use a variety of approaches to solve numeracy problems.
- We will be using concrete materials to assist with learning, and will ask children to sanitise their hands prior to handling these.
- Sumdog usernames and passwords will be checked and reissued as necessary to ensure we can utilise this resource.



### **Health and Wellbeing**

- The health and wellbeing of every child is a priority.
   Children are encouraged to take part in an emotional check in everyday and learn skills to regulate emotions.
- Resilience and nurture have been a focus since returning to school.
- We have been reinforcing Anti-Bullying messages and keeping safe in school and online.
- Children have two hours of PE per week, and regular opportunities to access outdoor and active learning.
- Children are encouraged to use strategies for independent learning and develop qualities of a successful learner.



### **Topic Work**

Contexts for learning are responsive to the needs and interests of learners. All topics are inter-disciplinary and allow children to learn through different subjects in a joined up way.

We have reached the end of our Social Studies topic about 'Our World'.

Next, we will be learning about Forces and Energy.
